Fire Hardening Grants Now Available!

The long-awaited Fire Hardening Grants are now available to those whose home or business was lost or damaged in the 2020 wildfires.

This is an opportunity to "Build Back Better"! You may be eligible to receive more than \$6,000 in money (including reimbursement) for fire hardening of your home or business. With \$5.7 million dollars available to residents of Jackson County and 155 applicants to date, millions of dollars of funding remain for those who are facing an expensive rebuild.

Bridges to Well-being brings wellness sessions to fire survivors through the Zone Captains program.

FREE Well-Being Groups support the social and emotional needs of fire survivors by reducing isolation post trauma. Facilitated by a mental health clinician, these are not formal therapeutic groups, but are designed to strengthen a group member's sense of belonging, develop coping skills, and offer education on post traumatic experiences.

Fire Hardening Grant

If your home or business was lost or damaged in a wildfire during 2020, you may be eligible to receive more than \$6,000 in grant money for fire hardening of your home or business. Local counties and the Department of Consumer and Business Services have created a fire hardening grant program to help people affected by the 2020 wildfires. The program will provide money directly to home and business owners who receive a grant to help pay for fire hardening of a home or business that was damaged or destroyed in the 2020 wildfires.
